


The following charts represent the results of questions that we posed to assess the benefits of engagement with the Partnership and potential areas of growth for the future.



How has your organization benefited from the Partnership in the last year?




How has WLP influenced your collaboration with entities outside the Partnership over the last year?






How has your organization benefited from being part of WLP's social media network?






Has your organization obtained any new sources of funding over the past year?






How did your engagement in the Partnership contribute to acquiring new sources of funding?











WLP Next Steps


Based on the information, feedback and suggestions that we collected in the Partnership Assessment, WLP is planning to take the following steps.



Communications



- Continue to develop and share story-driven content featuring partners and participants
- Hold communications meetings with partners to develop targeted strategies
- Evaluate and revise internal newsletters based on partner feedback and circulate at least two per year
- Increase sharing of Learning Center content with partners and public over social media
- Share language about Partnership impact for partners to use in fundraising and communications



Capacity Building








- Research and circulate targeted funding opportunities for partners
- Organize peer-to-peer exchanges for organizational capacity building, e.g. bridging the digital divide, communications and social media, economic cooperative model, monitoring implementation of SDGs
- Organize short training on how to write a case study for WLP workshops
- Regularly share information on international events on social media

Training and Curriculum




- Work with partners to create shortened training and advocacy content using pre-existing content
- Continue translating manuals into partner languages
- Compile and refine best practices and lessons learned on online facilitation
- Collect supplemental case studies from partners for different manuals
- Compile resources on cybersecurity to support partner work



TPC



- Convene a combination of in-person and online TPCs (as possible)
- Bring in guests to speak on timely topics and issues
- Support partner input in working groups on developing new initiatives
- Share updates on Partnership-wide impact
